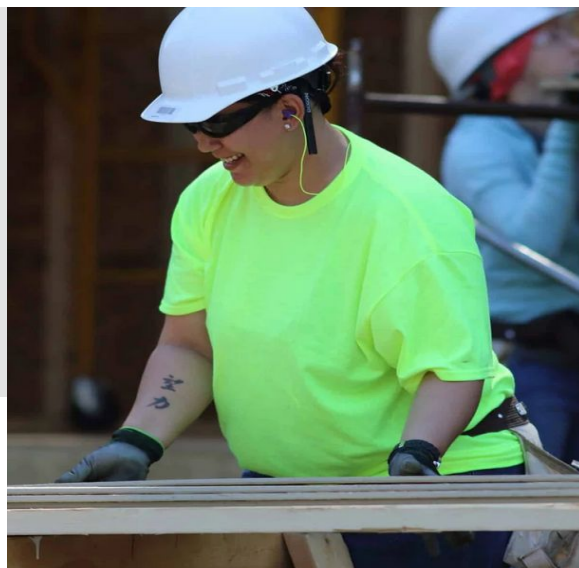

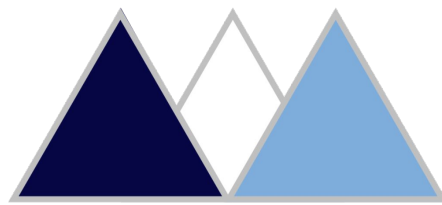


ADULT: Workforce services for eligible adults are available through one of the six core programs authorized by Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). The Adult program serves individuals and helps employers meet their workforce needs. It enables workers to obtain good jobs by providing them with job search assistance and training opportunities.

DISLOCATED WORKER: The Dislocated Worker program is designed to help workers get back to work as quickly as possible and overcome barriers to employment. When individuals become dislocated workers as a result of job loss, mass layoffs, global trade dynamics, or transitions in economic sectors, the Dislocated Worker program provides services to assist them in re-entering the workforce.

YOUTH: Services include a variety of the 14 basic elements relating to education and employment towards self-sufficiency. Youth, ages 16-24, receive stipends for time, wages for work experience, and Supportive Services including assistance with transportation and incentives for credentials and/or marking gains towards increased academics and employment.

OJT: On-The-Job Training or OJT is structured to benefit participants, as well as employers during the regular duration of training activities. The employer utilizes training methods, facilities, and resources in shaping the participant into a skilled employee that will be an asset to the organization, business, and/or industry, while being reimbursed for a portion of wages (50%-90%) earned, for the regular training period involved. OJT is a hire-first activity, meaning the participant must be successfully hired by the employer and will be retained upon completion of the contract.

Local Workforce Development Boards (LWDB's) serve as the administrative support and backbone of the statewide workforce development system. Local boards develop strategic plans to match employers with qualified candidates and offer skill-based programs to job-seekers through American Job Centers. Region VI is one of seven (7) regions located throughout the state of West Virginia. Region VI is comprised of a thirteen (13) county area in North Central West Virginia, serving the counties of Barbour, Braxton, Doddridge, Gilmer, Harrison, Lewis, Marion, Monongalia, Preston, Randolph, Taylor, Tucker and Upshur.

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) may be the answer. You could be eligible to receive a non-repayable scholarship up to \$12,000.

Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Individual Training Accounts (ITA's) are available to eligible and appropriate participants when it is determined by a career planner that they will be unlikely or unable to obtain or retain employment that leads to self-sufficiency or higher wages from previous employment through career services alone. An ITA is limited in cost and duration and must result in employment leading to economic self-sufficiency or wages comparable to or higher than wages from previous employment. ITAs are not entitlements and are contingent upon availability of funding from the US DOL. ITAs shall be provided to eligible participants on the basis of an individualized assessment of the person's job readiness, employment and training needs, financial, social and supportive needs, labor market demand and potential for successful completion, as documented on the participant's Individual Employment Plan (IEP). Participants choose career training with Region VI Eligible Training Providers in consultation with career planners.

DRS provides critical business options in the key areas of Staffing, Education and Financial Incentives. DRS employs employment specialists to help provide business owners and employers with real opportunities to build on their business or organizational success.



Students
