Disability Action Center Program Offerings:

<u>Traditional DAC Calendar of Events</u>: These are the "tried and true" DAC favorites that clients and families have been attending for years. These classes include social and recreational opportunity classes as well as more educational and informative geared classes... all while having fun! These classes are all offered in the afternoons typically from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. consecutively. Check the calendar of events to see what days each class is offered; there are two classes almost every afternoon on and off-site!

Experience It Co-Op: This is a partnership between the DAC and the Homestead Farm Center that provides a variety of classes and programs. These programs will be provided through classes and workshops available both during the day and afterschool. Many of these classes have a limit of seats, so calling in and reserving a seat is required as specified in the catalog and in the newsletter.

<u>Career Readiness Center and Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS) Programs:</u> DAC offers a variety of employment programs through the WV DRS including the Daniel Memorial Life Skills Training and Assessment, Work Skills Assessment, Community Based Assessment, Job Coaching and Job Placement. All career readiness programming is designed to help individuals find and secure gainful employment, learn independent living skills, explore potential jobs, and identify clients' work strengths and abilities. Additional programs and supports are available for students age 14-21 in Career Exploration and Job Readiness.

Advocacy: Get involved with one of our three advocacy groups:

- People First is a self-advocacy group of adults with developmental disabilities who meet monthly with their peers to learn their
 rights and responsibilities and how to speak for themselves, how to make their voices heard, and how to make choices and
 chances in their lives. Opportunities to advocate statewide including conferences and trainings.
- ABLE (Ability, Beauty, Leadership, and Education) is a network of women with disabilities whose focus is to empower peers to
 reach their fullest level of independence.
- MAN Club (Men's Advocacy Network) is a network of young men whose common purpose is to support and encourage one another in setting and reaching personal life goals.

<u>Mission Transition:</u> Serving Marion County students with special needs in grades 9-12, focusing on transition into college, work, and post-high school adult life. Students participate in customized workshops, work-based experiences, family workshops, and more.

<u>Camp CAN-DO</u>: Camp CAN-DO is a week-long summer camp focused on learning, growing, supporting one another, and showing that We Can Do Anything! DAC's Camp Can-Do is open to individuals of all abilities and ages. If an individual requires staffing, requires personal assistance, or is under the age of 13, support staffing must be provided throughout the camp day.

<u>Compass Project:</u> The DAC Partners with the WVU Center for Excellence in Disabilities to provide demonstrations and loans of adaptive devices for Information Technology, Community Living, Education, Employment, Recreation, and Mobility.

<u>Special Olympics of Marion County:</u> Special Olympics offers children and adults with intellectual disabilities opportunities to participate in bowling, basketball, cheerleading, cycling, golf, volleyball, bocce, track & field, and tennis. Athletes participate both locally and on a state and national level.

<u>Homestead Farm Center:</u> Offers both onsite and offsite programming including many partnership programs under Experience IT Co-Op and the RURAL Program.

- RURAL (Rural to Urban Agricultural Learning) A one of a kind Farm to Urban outdoor learning program focusing on farming, gardening, livestock care, landscaping, use of agricultural resources.
- SOW and GROW SUSTAIN: Encourages participants to bring skills learned on the farm and food resources they have raised back to their own families and neighborhoods.
- Harvest at Home: Trains and supports participants with developmental disabilities in the creation of raised-bed gardens in
 their own backyards, so that they can bring their gardening skills back into their home communities and provide healthy food
 for their families and neighbors.
- Day at the Farm and Farm Tours Programs: Farm Tours are one-day farm experiences open to small special education classes and community organizations; contact HFC to schedule.



What is Full Circle?

The Full Circle Program is a very unique program that provides adults with the opportunity to acquire and improve functional skills.

<u>Who is it for?</u> The Full Circle Program is for ANYONE in the community. Participants do not have to be signed up for unemployment to take advantage of these workshops.

<u>How much does it cost to attend?</u> All Full Circle Workshops are FREE to anyone in the community.

<u>What kind of Workshops are Offered?</u> Full Circle offers workshops in Basic Computer Skills, Microsoft Office Programs, Resume Writing, Interview Skills, Finding Jobs Online, Filling Out Online Job Applications for Beginners, and much more. Workshops are typically 2-3 hours and offered during scheduled hours.

<u>What kind of certifications are offered?</u> Full Circle also offers certifications in Computer Essentials, Microsoft Word, and Microsoft Excel.

The West Virginia Department of Education recognizes that today's workplace presents numerous opportunities and challenges for adults in West Virginia. Employers need workers with strong basic skills and an ability to adapt to change. Today's families are faced with multiple responsibilities as they address their children's educational needs, as well as their own. The Adult Basic Education Program (ABE) of the West Virginia Department of Education has developed such a system for adult learners. ABE programs provide adults with the opportunity to acquire and improve functional skills necessary to enhance the quality of their lives as workers, family members, and citizens. These programs play an important role in fostering productive employment, effective citizenship, personal and family growth, self-esteem, and dignity for adult learners.

- Obtain problem-solving and thinking skills needed to meet the growing demands of higher education requirements

TO QUALIFY FOR JOB CORPS, STUDENTS MUST BE...

16 TO 24 YEARS OLD

16 to 24-year-olds ready to work toward a successful future are welcome. The maximum age limit may be waived if the applicant is a person with a documented disability. For minors, a parent or guardian must sign a consent form.

IN NEED OF JOB SKILLS

The applicant faces one or more barriers to employment like needing additional career technical training, education, counseling, and/or assistance to complete regular schoolwork or to secure and maintain employment.

LOW-INCOME ELIGIBLE

Applicants must meet one or more of these conditions: receives public assistance, earns poverty-level income, is homeless, is a foster child, or qualifies for free or reduced-price lunch. Your admissions counselor will help you determine your eligibility.

ABLE TO WORK IN THE USA

The applicant is a legal resident of the U.S. or a U.S territory or a lawfully admitted permanent resident alien, refugee, asylee, parolee, or immigrant who has been authorized by the U.S. attorney general to work in the United States.



Jobs & Hope West Virginia is the state's comprehensive response to the substance use disorder crisis. Established by Governor Jim Justice and the West Virginia Legislature, this program offers support through a statewide collaboration of agencies that provide West Virginians in recovery the opportunity to obtain career training and to ultimately secure meaningful employment.

Who is eligible?

West Virginia resident* 18 years and older
Participant has employment as their goal, and
Participant has an obstacle to obtaining employment, and
Participant is ready for career training/education or job placement, and
Participant plans to enroll in a training and/or educational program, and
Participant is committed to maintaining recovery, and
Participant agrees to random drug testing throughout the program and will provide the results to the Transition Agent.

*must be U.S. citizens or eligible noncitizens an eligible noncitizen is someone who meets one of the following criteria: A U.S. permanent resident with a Permanent Resident Card (I-551), also known as a green card.



Senior Community Service Employment Program

The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) provides training, skill development and work experience for low-income persons age 55 years and older.

SCSEP enrollees are assigned to job training positions with public and private, nonprofit agencies. Preference is given to agencies that serve the elderly or are involved in intergenerational activities that foster a positive image of the elderly in the community.

There are many benefits of SCSEP besides wages. You upgrade your job-seeking skills, learn or upgrade specific job skills and have an annual physical examination. In addition, you receive information and supportive services in Social Security benefits, income tax requirements, nutrition, consumer education and personal grooming. Many enrollees gain reentry into the competitive labor force.

SCSEP is administered by Preston County Senior Citizens, Inc. in Boone, Clay, Doddridge, Harrison, Kanawha, Monongalia, Preston, Putnam, Raleigh, Taylor and Wyoming Counties.

Southwestern Community Action Council offers the Senior Community Services Employment Program (SCSEP) in twenty-one counties in West Virginia and four counties in Kentucky, including Boyd, Carter, Greenup, and Lewis counties. Our primary office is in Huntington, with offices in Logan and Beckley as well as Ashland, KY.

The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) provides temporary community service training opportunities to older Americans to prepare them for jobs in their community. SCSEP participants train an average of 20 hours a week and are paid a training stipend that is the highest of federal, state, or local minimum wage directly by SCSEP. Participants are placed in a wide variety of community service training assignments at nonprofit and public facilities, such as senior centers, day care centers, schools, and hospitals. This onthe-job training experience can then be used as a bridge to find employment opportunities outside of the program. The nonprofit National Council on Aging (NCOA) is a national sponsor of SCSEP.

To participate in SCSEP, you must be aged 55 or older, unemployed, and meet financial guidelines. Please contact your local SCSEP office to learn more about the financial qualifications.

West Virginia Women Work (WVWW) is a statewide 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that supports and advocates for education, employment, and economic equity for all women. For over 20 years the organization has strived to help women in West Virginia earn a living wage. We achieve this goal through a comprehensive program of recruitment, training, referrals, placements, networking, advocacy, retention activities, and public workshops. The primary focus of the organization's activities is to help women explore, train and secure employment in nontraditional occupations, especially the skilled trades. Our organization has served over 1,000 women in West Virginia with our career coaching service, computer literacy classes and public career exploration workshops.

Step Up for Women is a post-secondary, tuition free, 12-week skilled trades training course conducted in Morgantown and Charleston West Virginia. The program is a hybrid of online and hands on learning. The program launched in 2001 and prepares adult students for entry level construction jobs and helps participants overcome barriers to non-traditional employment. The program combines job-readiness classroom topics, role model and employer interactions, physical conditioning, and hands-on training in carpentry, electrical wiring, and plumbing. Participants can graduate with three industry recognized licenses and certifications. During the training they receive a transportation reimbursement as well as a work clothes, steel toed boots and safety gear. Graduates receive a set of tools to begin their new career. Our students learn the essential skills to find and keep a job including resume writing, interview skills, job search techniques, communication, budgeting and personal finance, and basic math review.

While attending Step Up for Women, students can explore different trades and career paths. Students will meet with former graduates working in nontraditional jobs, meet representatives from apprenticeship programs, visit apprenticeship training centers, and explore construction careers during field trips. Graduates are encouraged to learn nontraditional skills and assisted in navigating the often-confusing path to obtaining gainful employment in the skilled trades. Apply online with the QR code:

The goal of YouthBuild is to give young adults the tools to get a good job and keep it. YouthBuild works to develop the capacity of young adults to be responsible members of their families and communities by:

- Strengthening educational backgrounds
- Teaching marketable skills and entrepreneurship
- Instilling leadership values that relate to home, work and community.

YouthBuild participants earn money while they get valuable hands-on experience building quality houses. This work is reinforced with classroom instruction, job shadowing and personal guidance. GED preparation and testing is another key component of the program. Out-of-school youth ages 16 to 24 are eligible to apply.

The students are also provided with Entrepreneurship Education through a mixture of classroom and on-the-job settings. The goal of YouthBuild's Entrepreneurship Program is to provide a new set of skills to participants — skills they could use to start a new business themselves or to bring "entrepreneurship" to a job in small business, the most likely source of their future employment.

*YouthBuild offers an educational stipend of \$4.25/hr for classroom instruction, and once on the job that increases to \$8.75/hr. The program lasts between six to ten months.
